
### HONOURS IN FRENCH LANGUAGE, LITERATURES AND CULTURES

- To enter the Honours program, a student must have:
  - Attained third-year standing (54 credits completed), or be entering Year 3
  - Maintained a B+ average in both their French courses and their overall degree program
  - Completed FREN 311 and 352
  - Completed FREN 401 and 402, or demonstrated a proficiency level of B2

#### MINOR IN FRENCH LANGUAGE

- Students with limited or no background in French.
- Not available to native speakers of French or those whose entry point is FREN 401 (CEFR B2) or higher.
- The maximum credits that you can be exempt are 6 credits (FREN 201 & 202)




